The All Faith Committee of the Theodore Roosevelt Council, BSA has created a new award for Cubs, Scouts and Venturers to earn. The purpose of the award is to promote a Scout's ***Duty to God*** and to emphasize the twelfth point of the Scout Law, ***A Scout is Reverent***.

The requirements focus on participation in All Faith Events such as the Ten Commandment Hike as well as requiring each applicant to earn the appropriate religious award for his faith and division of Scouting.

The award can be earned once as a Cub Scout, once as a Boy Scout and once as a Venturer. There is a single medal awarded with a miniature device pin for each level the award is earned in attached to the purple and white ribbon of the award.

For additional information on earning the award, contact your unit's Religious Award Coordinator, or the council office.

Once you have completed the requirements for the award for your branch of Scouting, submit the part of the application that applies to you to the council office. Remember to include the required essay with the application.

Once your application and essay are approved, you will be asked to submit a fee of \$15.00 for the medal. It might be the practice of your troop or pack to pay for religious medals for their members. Please check with your unit leader.

Medals should be presented at an appropriate court of honor or at a service during scout week.
